Daily Bible readings for home devotions, March 21-26, '16

Mon Zechariah 9:9-10 describes Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, starting the countdown that ended on Easter Sunday. The *daughters of Zion/Jerusalem* represent God's children, whom the Father cherishes as his darling daughters, who lament what people do against their dear Father. Jesus had warnings for them about stormy days ahead (Luke 23:28).

Tues Luke 19:28-40 Did the disciples catch on that they were standing in the doorway between Old and New? Yes, for the Holy Spirit prompted them to rejoice and praise God in the words of Psalm 118 (37-38)—and not get drowned out by the dissonance of others (39). [The cobblestones and masonry would shriek aloud at a later time, when Jerusalem got destroyed.]

Wed Philippians 2:5-11 lays out the entire set of salvation miracles: The Son of God, eternal and almighty, became mortal (6-7), humbling Himself and being humiliated (4). *Therefore* (for this very reason) the Father put Jesus back at the TOP, where He belonged (9). Within these few verses the Holy Spirit specifies His origin, His mission, and His exaltation. Wonderful!

Maundy Thursday: Hebrews 10:5-18 The heavenly Father prepared a human body for His Son, Jesus (5) for the specific purpose of canceling the Levitical set-up of animal sacrifices via His own self-sacrifice (5-10)—which did the job that all the others couldn't (11-12), to atone for sins/sinners (13-15). In the Lord's Supper we concentrate on His great accomplishment for us.

Good Friday John 19:17-30 After noting some externals such as the setting on Golgotha, Pilate's refusal to capitulate (19-22), and the soldiers' gambling (22-24), John gets specific about himself in Jesus' family circle (25-27). At about 3:00 p.m. Jesus expired. All according to blueprint (28-30). Amen!

Sat 1 Peter 3:18-22 We make a brief detour from Golgotha, where Jesus *brought us to God* via His death – to a scene nobody on Earth could witness: Jesus' Descent into Hell. "What was He doing <u>there</u>?" we ask. Answer: In His glorified body Jesus appeared in Satan's prison in order to demonstrate (visibly, vocally) that He was the Master over Satan, death, and hell. That hellish place was filled with souls who disbelieved God (the great majority perished in the Flood), but Jesus did not descend to their level in order to grant them a reprieve. Since the wages of sin is death, "It is appointed for humans to die once, but after this [the next event for them will be] the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27). Therefore we deduce that Jesus appeared in Hell to proclaim His divine, dominant authority—not to evangelize.

How awful to be damned, without hope, and past rescue! NOW is the day of salvation via Jesus' blood and righteousness.

⁵ Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, ⁷ but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. ⁹ Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, ¹¹ and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ³⁹ And some of the Pharisees called to Him from the crowd, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples." ⁴⁰ But He answered and said to them, "I tell you that if these should keep silent, the stones would immediately cry out."
