Our History and Our Church Body, the CLC

Messiah Congregation has its roots in the days of the Synodical Conference, an organization composed of four individual Lutheran synods, including the Missouri, the Wisconsin, and Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS, also known as the Little Norwegian). The devil always tries to add false teaching to the church with the goal that as a leaven or cancer the false teaching will spread to the heart of the Gospel.

The Synodical Conference had stood for decades as a faithful beacon of God's truth, despite a number of doctrinal attacks. The Missouri Synod began to falter in the 1940's and error was introduced and tolerated. In the 1950's as the Wisconsin Synod and the ELS reacted to this error, they themselves fell into error. In obedience to the Word of God (Rom. 16:17-18), individuals and



congregations began to leave these erring synods and formed a new synod that took the name "Church of the Lutheran Confession" (CLC).

Messiah began to meet and organize in December of 1960 and was one of the founding congregations of the CLC. Messiah found land at 2015 N. Hastings Way and built a modest church. In 1963 the small group began a Christian day school. Over the years the LORD has graciously granted growth, both spiritually and in numbers. The congregation has grown from a handful to nearly 900 souls, the school from 24 students to about 145. The modest church was enlarged, two classrooms added, then three more classrooms, then a fellowship hall. Finally, in 2007, a new sanctuary was built, and the former sanctuary was remodeled to provide two more classrooms, a library, and two offices.

Our history is a testimony to the grace of God Who has been merciful to us sinners. All glory belongs to Him, for who we are today and for what can be seen on our property. What He has freely given to us, we seek to share freely with others.

Worship at Messiah

Saturdays: Worship Service, 6:30 pm + "Sunday" School and Bible Class, 7:45 pm Sundays: Worship Service, 9:00 am + Sunday School and Bible Class, 10:15 am During the school year, Young Adults meet for Bible study after Sunday worship. Midweek services during Advent and Lent, 1:00 & 6:30 pm

Other special services are held according to the schedule in our annual Yearbook. The 2021 Yearbook will be available later in February.

Other helpful things to know:

- Communion is served on both the first and second weekends of the month.
- There are registration sheets for Communion in the Narthex. Either the week before or the day of Communion, please put a check or your initials next to your name if you plan to commune.
- The words for our order of service are projected in the front of the sanctuary. If you prefer, you may use the Liturgy Folder, found in the pew, to follow along with a printed format.
- We have two hymnals. One is "The Lutheran Hymnal" (red), with hymns 1 through 660. The other is the "Worship Supplement 2000" (tan), with hymns 701 through 800.
- If there is inclement weather and services are canceled, there will be a notice on Messiah's website, <u>www.eauclairemessiah.com</u>, and an email notification through *Messiah News & Needs* (see below). Local radio stations will also be notified. If you prefer, you can be contacted by phone in the event of a weather cancellation (contact the church office or a pastor).

Bible Studies

There are many opportunities for growth in God's Word and fellowship with other Messiah members:

- Our weekend Bible studies, which follow the Saturday and Sunday worship services.
- Youth Bible study (mainly high school age), which follows the Sunday worship service.
- The "Messiah Home Bible Studies" program offers small-group study and fellowship in the homes of our members in the Eau Claire area. See the weekly bulletin for information about when and where these groups meet.
- The "Messiah Mutual Support Group" is made up of Messiah members who have been in successful recovery from substance or behavioral addictions, as well as those who are now struggling. - From time to time there are special seminars, workshops, retreats, and other opportunities for Christian growth. These will be announced in the weekly bulletin.

Staying in Touch

- You will be assigned a church mailbox, found in the narthex (that is, the church foyer). You will find the monthly calendar there, special announcements, and other miscellaneous information. You may also use the church mailboxes for correspondence with other members, such as invitations and cards. Please pick up items from your church mailbox each time you attend worship.
- If you happen to miss worship, you may view our services via live stream at 9 am on Sunday morning. Previously recorded services are also online at www.eauclairemessiah.com click the "Online Worship" button. The weekly bulletin and church calendar are also available on the site.
- Upcoming events, devotional articles, and other information are posted on Messiah's Facebook page: <u>www.facebook.com/EauClaireMessiah</u>.
- Messiah has a weekly email subscription service, called *Messiah News and Needs*. - Our church body's monthly magazine is *The Lutheran Spokesman*. All members are automatically subscribed. We also distribute *Daily Rest*. This is a quarterly collection of brief daily devotions which are centered on God's Word. Please talk to our church secretary or one of the pastors about subscribing.
- Older gentlemen of the congregation meet weekly at Perkins Restaurant for breakfast and camaraderie. This is normally on Tuesdays at 9:00 am; check the weekly bulletin to confirm.

Personalized Services

Messiah's pastors provide individual spiritual counseling for a variety of needs. They have extensive experience using God's Word to help resolve marital and family conflicts, as well as to help deal with substance abuse or other problems. If you are in need of assistance, one of them will be happy to meet with you at church or in your home. Private Communion is always available for those who need added strengthening of faith. If you or a loved one are hospitalized or are experiencing some other crisis, please do call one of Messiah's pastors.

Messiah Lutheran School

Messiah is committed to Christian education. Our grade school enrolls students from Pre-K through 8th grade. Our current enrollment is about 130 students, who are taught by 6 full time and 4 part time teachers. How Messiah Organizes its Work

Jesus is the Head of His Church: All matters on which the verbally inspired Scriptures speak will be decided by the Word of God. Messiah's Voters are made up of all male communicant members who are at least 18 years of age, who request voting membership, and agree to function under the Constitution. While decision-making authority in smaller matters is delegated by the Voters to officers, Boards, and Committees, the Voters have final authority over all congregational decisions.
